

Support Our Troops...

Crochet a Helmet Liner

Materials:

Size K and H hooks

6 oz. soft worsted weight 100% wool yarn

Accepted colors are tan, brown, olive, gray and black (black is preferred)

Size: Adult Large

Crochet Notes:

Made in rounds – that is, do not join and do not turn.

Other Notes:

The headgear our military issues are usually made of synthetic fibers or blends and our troops in places like Afghanistan, Iraq and Kosovo are still cold.

Please use a soft 100% wool worsted weight yarn to keep them warm.

Rnd 1Form a ring around your finger, work 6 sc in ring
Rnd 22 scs in next 6 sts (12 sts)
Rnd 3(sc in next st, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (18 sts)
Rnd 4(sc in next 2 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (24 sts)
Rnd 5(sc in next 3 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (30 sts)
Rnd 6(sc in next 4 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (36 sts)
Rnd 7(sc in next 5 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (42 sts)
Rnd 8(sc in next 6 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (48 sts)
Rnd 9(sc in next 7 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (54 sts)
Rnd 10(sc in next 8 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (60 sts)
Rnd 11(sc in next 9 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (66 sts)
Rnd 12(sc in next 10 sts, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (72 sts)

Work over 72 sts until piece measures 7 inches.

Chain 22 ,skip 20 sts, continue working around until piece measures 10 more inches.

Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach yarn anywhere in face hole and sc around with H hook. Fasten off and weave in all ends.

SUPPORT OUR TROOPS..... CROCHET PATTERN FOR HELMETLINER

Equipment: Size K and G hooks
Yarn: 5 oz. soft worsted weight 100% wool in tan,
brown, olive, gray or black
Size: Adult Large
Abbreviations:
sc, scs single crochet, single crochets
st, sts stitch, stitches
tbl through back loop
sl st, sl sts slip stitch, slip stitches
ch chain



Notes: Helmetliner cap is worked in rounds, "ribbing" around neck and face is attached by slipstitching vertical rows of single crochet to the edge of the cap, as the rows are worked.

Cap: Round 1—make a slip stitch ring. With size K hook, work 6 sc in ring.
Round 2—2 scs in next 6 sts (12sts)
Round 3—(sc in next st, 2 scs in next st) 6 times (18 sts).
Rounds 4 through 12—continue as in Round 3, working 1 more sc between
increases and increasing 6 scs in each round, until there are 72 sts total.
Work over 72 sts until cap measures about 7-1/2 " from beg.

Ribbing over forehead: With yarn still attached and size G hook, chain 5, turn, skip 1st
ch, sc in the next 3 ch (4 sc made), 2 sl sts in next 2 sts on cap edge. * Turn.
Skip 2 sl sts, work 4 sc (tbl), ch 1, turn. Work 3 scs (tbl), 2 sl sts in next 2 sts
on cap edge.* Working along the edge of the cap, REPEAT from * to * for a total
of 28 rows (14 "ribbed" ridges). Turn, work 4 scs (tbl) and CHAIN 25.

Neck ribbing: Turn, skip 1st ch, sc in 24 ch AND in 4 sc (tbl) at forehead edge, sl st in
next 2 stitches on cap edge. ** Turn, skip 2 sl sts, 28 scs (tbl), ch1. Turn, sk 1st
sc, 28 sc (tbl), 2 sl sts in next 2 sts on cap edge.** REPEAT from ** to ** until
ribbing is worked around entire edge of cap (72 rows, 36 ridges, including
forehead). Turn, skip 2 sl sts, join beginning edge of forehead ribbing to neck
ribbing with 4 sl sts, and continue row with 25 scs (tbl). Ch 1, turn. Work 24 scs
(tbl), ch 1, turn. Continue to work back and forth on rows until there are 28 rows,
14 ridges, ending at bottom edge of ribbing. Match the vertical edges of neck
ribbing and sl st together to close, 25 sl sts, ending at corner of face opening.

Face opening: With yarn still attached, work one row of approximately 70 scs around the
face opening. Fasten off and weave in ends.
